

## DIES AT EIGHTY-THREE

**Mrs. Henry Rampton Died of Pneumonia at Home in Bountiful, Wednesday, after a Brief Illness.**

Mrs. Francis Rampton, widow of the late Henry Rampton, and a resident of Bountiful for more than half a century, passed away at a quarter to six o'clock, Wednesday evening Feb. 15th, of pneumonia, after but little more than a week's illness.

Mrs. Rampton was eighty-three years old on the eighth of this month. She was born at Warrington, Cheshire, England. She was the daughter of James and Elizabeth Dinwoody.

She emigrated to America in 1854, her parents having come over the year before. She remained in St. Louis two years before coming to the valley. It was there she met and was mar-

ried to Henry Rampton on the 25th of December, 1854. They arrived here in Utah in 1856, locating in Bountiful, where she lived up to the time of her death.

For many years the deceased was an active worker in the East Bountiful Relief Society, serving as treasurer of that organization.

While of a quiet and home-loving disposition, she was ever ready to minister unto others who were in need.

She was the mother of eight children, seven boys and one girl. One son died in infancy and her son William passed away five years ago. The six living children are, Henry, Charles, Arthur, Walter and Fred Rampton and Mrs. G. V. Pace.

Two brothers, William Dinwoody of Saint Louis and James Dinwoody of Salt Lake, preceded her to the great beyond by several years, and it has been over seven years since her husband passed away.

Deceased was a faithful Latter-day Saint and a genuine mother in every sense of the term.

Funeral services will be held in the East Bountiful Tabernacle at 2 p. m., Sunday.
