

Frederick Rampton Dies Unexpectedly

Frederick Rampton 56 died very unexpectedly, at his home in Bountiful Tuesday night, of heart trouble after an illness of about two weeks.

For a number of years Mr Rampton was manager of the Farmers' Feed & Produce company afterwards acquiring the property.

He was born in Bountiful and always lived here. He was the son of Henry and Frances Dinwoodey Rampton two of Bountiful's first pioneers.
