

The funeral services over the remains of the late Henry Rampton, who passed away on Nov. 24th, were held in the East Bountiful tabernacle, Sunday, Nov. 29th at 1 p. m. In addition to the local speakers there were present and spoke, Editor C. W. Penrose of the Deseret News, Elder B. S. Young of Salt Lake City and Judge Rolapp of Ogden. Elder Young and Judge Rolapp were in England on a mission with the deceased, twenty years ago. The attendance at the funeral was very large. Deceased was seventy-four years old. He was born in Old Alsford, Hampshire, England. He arrived in Utah in 1836, located in Bountiful which has been his home since. Deceased run a blacksmith shop in the center of town from shortly after he arrived in the valley until just a year or two before his death, so there was scarcely a boy or girl in the south-end of Davis Co. who did not know "Brother Rampton." He was a very active worker in the Sabbath school, being one of the first, if not the first, superintendent of the Bountiful Sunday school. For many years he also served as counselor to Bishops Call and Stoker, which position he held up to not so very long before his death. He leaves fourteen children and thirty-four grandchildren.
